All Church Book Study: *Sailboat Church*

We are asking our entire church to read the book, *Sailboat Church*, by former General Assembly Moderator, Joan Gray, and to join one of our six-week discussion groups. Rev. Essentially, rowboat churches and sailboat churches both require work in order to get to where God's wants a church to go. But, the difference is where the energy comes from to move the boat.
